About the Program

Students in Geography study human interactions with the environment across geographic scales, from local to global. This minor is designed to provide an opportunity to complement major programs in other disciplines with a range of courses in Geography. The program has a core of five courses that introduce basic concepts in Geography. Thereafter one may combine higher level courses in Geography that either continue the breadth of the core or which focus on a particular theme such as resource management, the biophysical environment, or rural and agricultural systems. Students taking this program should consult [faculty advisors](#) in the department for advice on the choice of senior courses.
